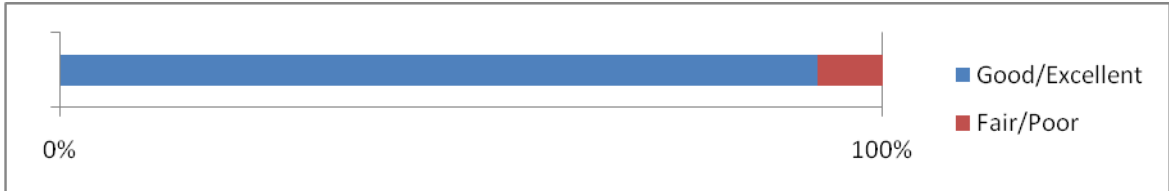


Dalat Annual Parent Survey Results 2007

Survey was taken in May 2007. 100 surveys were completed including 75 in English, 17 in Chinese and 8 in Korean from 248 Dalat families, a 40% response.

1. In your opinion how good is your child's/children's preparation for their next grade level?



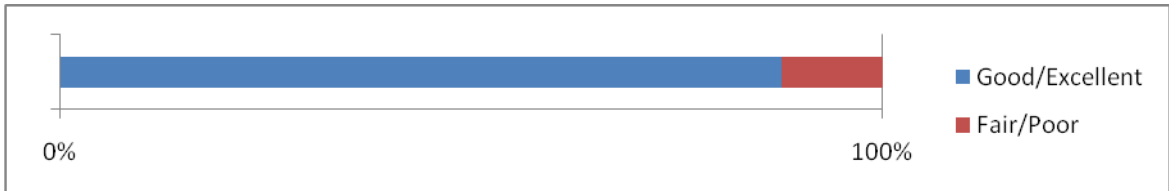

3. How would you rate the quality of education at Dalat?



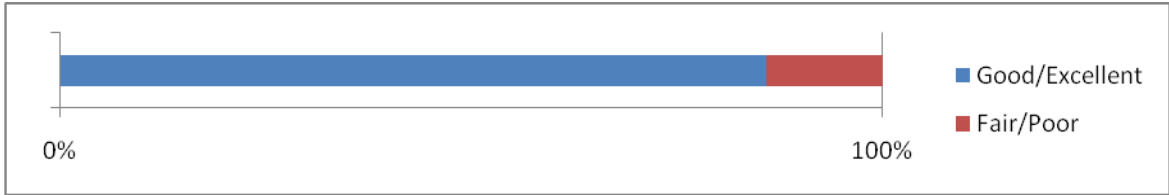

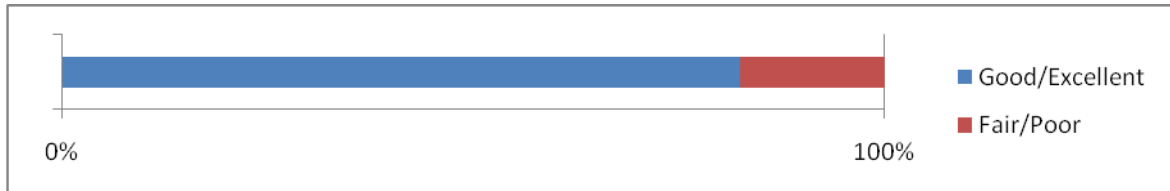

10. How would you rate your overall satisfaction with your child's/children's teacher/s?



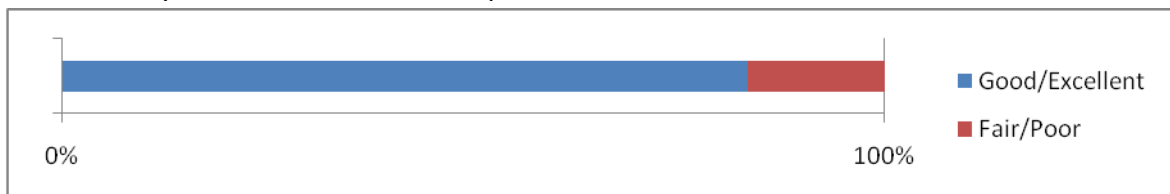

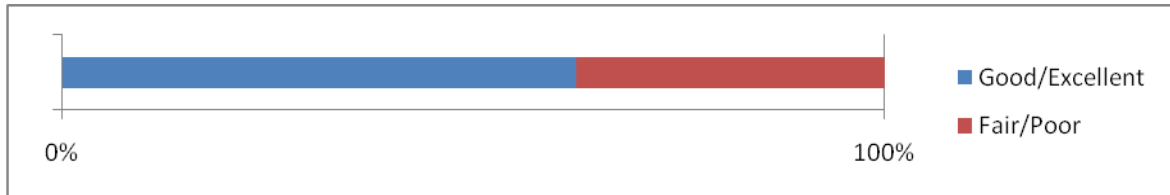
- Mrs. Roger's response and help improving our son's study habits was excellent.

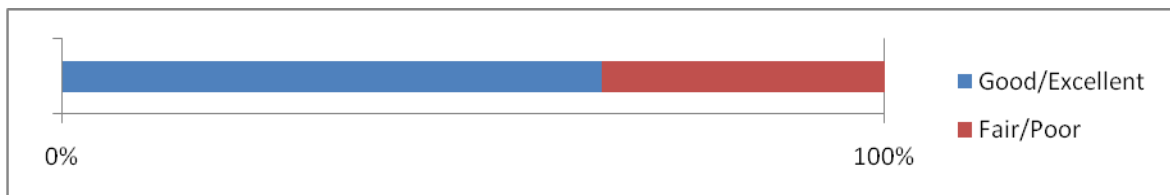
Too much – 23

15. How satisfied are you with the facilities at Dalat?

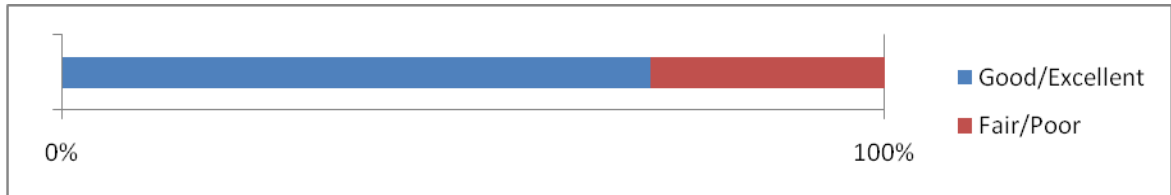

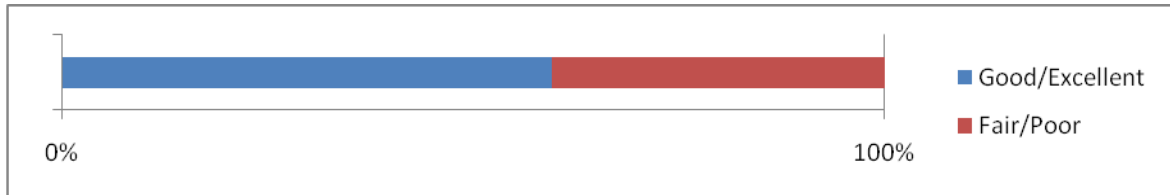

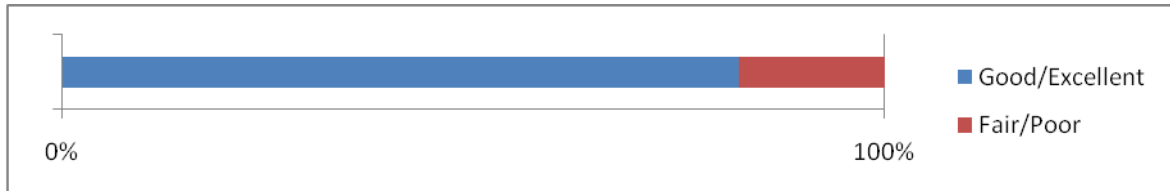
- Versatile sports and cultural activity.

24. How would you rate the sense of community at Dalat?



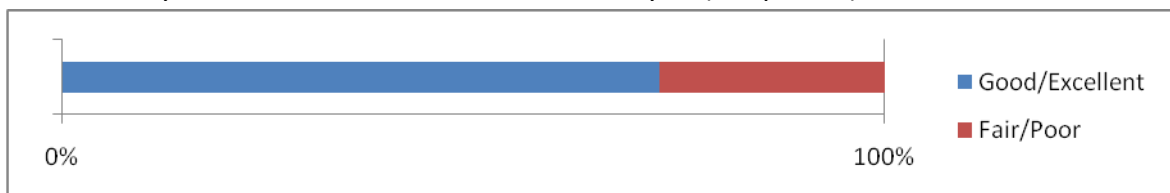

26. How would you rate Dalat's communication with you (the parent)?



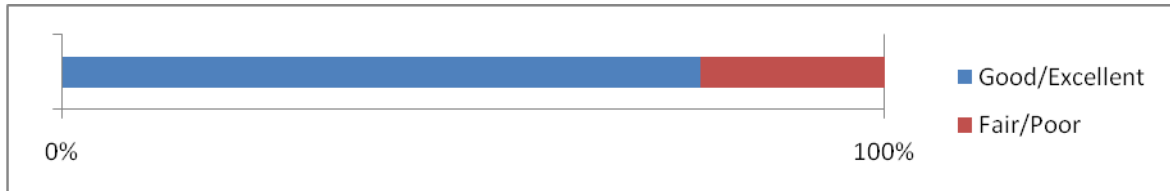

30. How would you rate your overall satisfaction of Dalat?



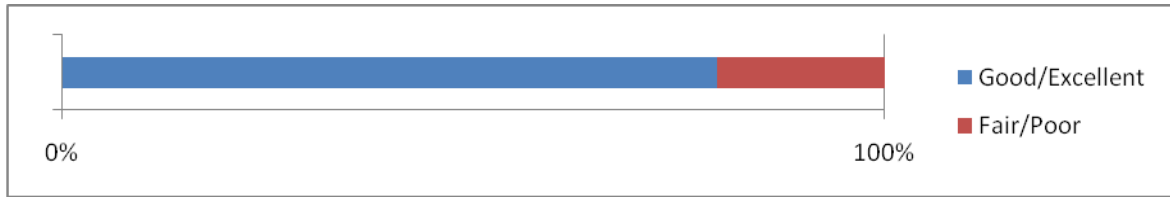

32. How would you rate the leadership of Dalat?



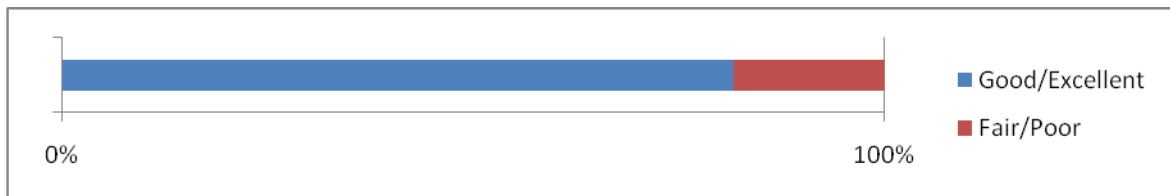

34. How confident do you feel about Dalat's future?



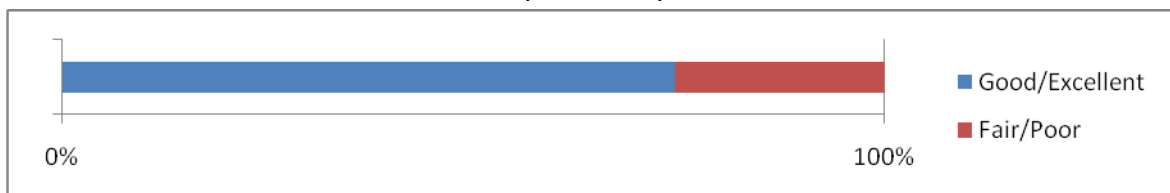

36. How well does Dalat meet the needs of your family?

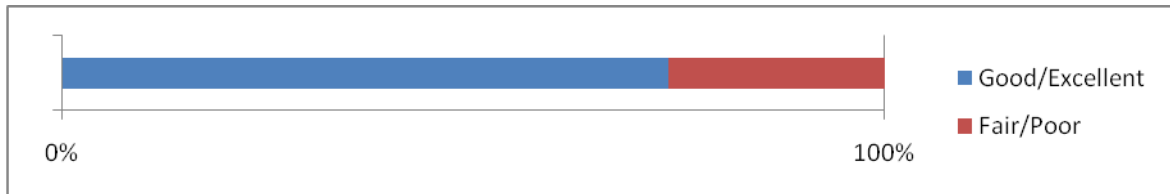
